Town Completes Project to Digitize Records



In June, the Town completed at 4-month scanning project, funded through a NYS Department of Education Records Management Grant, to digitize building permits and associated records. By the end of the project, our Grant Staff had scanned over 37,000 pages of records. Not only does this project make retrieval of records much easier for both staff and residents needing copies of their records, but it also protects

the records from the possibility of being damaged or destroyed due to natural disaster. Recognizing the many benefits in converting paper copy to digital format, the Town is considering expanding the scanning initiative to other business functions within Town government. We are grateful to the NYS Dept. of Education for making this project possible.

News from the Town of Waterford Highway Department

This summer the highway crew repaired the tennis courts at Garrett Field. They look great and were used frequently by area students and residents. This year the Town participated in a free computer and electronics recycling program, which coincided with our Trash Drop Off, and the last day for both programs will be October 27th. Please visit our website for details on accepted items. The Household Hazardous Waste Day was held on October 6th and there were more than 50 registrants from both the town and village. Due to the growing interest we plan to make this an annual event.

Yard waste collection occurs every Monday and Friday throughout the year, weather permitting. All grass clippings, leaves and small twigs must be in biodegradable bags and weigh no more than 40 lbs. All brush and branches must be no longer than 4 feet in length and tied in manageable bundles. The Town of Waterford's leaf vacuum collector truck will be out beginning in October and continue until the third week of November, weather permitting. All residents in our developments are asked to bring leaves only to the edge of the roadway, not in the road. This allows the Highway Crew to pick up the leaves in a safe and efficient manner. By following these guidelines we can ensure the Highway Department services are safe for both the workers and residents. Thank you and have a safe holiday season.

Important Safety Tips From our Building Inspector:

Amanda's Law went into effect on February 22, 2010. It requires new and existing one- and two-family residences to have at least one carbon monoxide alarm installed on the lowest floor of the building having a sleeping area. The alarm must be clearly audible in all sleeping areas over background noise levels with all intervening doors closed.

In addition to installing carbon monoxide alarms, homeowners should take the following actions to help reduce their risk and stay safe:

- Test and/or replace alarms according to the manufacturer's instructions;
- Have heating systems, vents, and chimney's and flues tested, inspected and cleaned by a qualified technician each year;
- Regularly examine vents and chimneys for improper connections, rust, soot or other debris;
- Never run a vehicle, generator or other fuel powered motor indoors, even if garage doors are open to the outdoors;
- Never use a gas oven to heat a home, and only use barbecue grills outdoors- never in a house or garage; and
- Remember that carbon monoxide alarms are not substitutes for smoke alarms. Smoke alarms should also be installed on every level of a home as well as in or outside sleeping areas..

From the Office of the Public Safety Commissioner.....

With the upcoming winter season drawing near, it is time to remind everyone, how to drive in snow. If the roads are bad, or a storm is forecast to be heading your way - stay home. But in reality, there are times that you cannot do this or that you're already out when the weather hits. These tips will help you get to your destination as safe as possible.

Driving safely on icy roads:

- Decrease your speed and leave yourself plenty of room to stop. You should allow at least three times more space than usual between you and the car in front of you.
- Brake gently to avoid skidding. If your wheels start to lock up, ease off the brake.
- Turn on your lights to increase your visibility to other motorists.
- Keep your lights and windshield clean.
- Be especially careful on bridges, overpasses and infrequently traveled roads, which will freeze first. Even at temperatures above freezing, if the conditions are wet, you might encounter ice in shady areas or on exposed roadways like bridges.

If you get stuck:

*Do not spin your wheels. This will only dig you in deeper. *Turn your wheels from side to side a few times to push snow out of the way. *Use a light touch on the gas, to ease your car out. *Pour sand, kitty litter, gravel or salt in the path of the wheels, to help get traction.

Have a great upcoming Holiday Season, stay safe and please don't drink and drive.

If your front wheels skid:

Take your foot off the gas and shift to neutral, but don't try to steer immediately. As the wheels skid sideways, they will slow the vehicle and traction will return. As it does, steer in the direction you want to go. Then put the transmission in "drive" or release the clutch, and accelerate gently.

If your rear wheels skid:

- Take your foot off the accelerator.
- Steer in the direction you want the front wheels to go. If your rear wheels are sliding left, steer left. If they're sliding right, steer right. You might have to steer left and right a few times to get your vehicle completely under control.
- If you have standard brakes, pump them gently. If you have anti-lock brakes (ABS), do not pump the brakes. Apply steady pressure to the brakes. You will feel the brakes pulse -this is normal.


