Who can receive food?

Residents of Waterford (zip code 12188) who are in need of food assistance can receive food on a regular basis. Emergency assistance is also provided regardless of residence.

How can I receive food?

You will need to visit the pantry of your choice and complete an application. You will be asked to identify the names and ages of the people in your household, and provide proof of residency.

How often is food received?

Pantry guests can receive food pantry bags, based on family size, once a month or in emergency.
